

Dramatic Performance Rights License and Grand Rights License To Perform

- Professional Actors, Ministers, and Music Directors are asked to apply for a Dramatic Performance Rights license also called a Grand Rights license for a license to perform **A Soundtrack for St. John**. Please send your interest to the email address in the contact information on this website so that details, pricing, and an application for consideration can be sent to you. Put “License To Perform Request” in the subject line so that your request will be easily noticed in the emails.
- Include your mailing address in the email.
- You will, of course, need an adequate amplification system to make the music sound like a live symphony orchestra performing. You will be rented .wav files for your performance. In addition to the Reader and the Music Director to cue the Reader from the score and play the .wav files on a computer, you may need a DJ with an adequate sound system to perform this work. And, obviously, rehearsals with all people involved will be needed to make your performance sound professional.
- Listen to the .mp3 files of **A Soundtrack for St. John** so that you will know how the work is to be performed.
- If you plan to perform **A Soundtrack for St. John** in a language other than English, please state that in your request. You must be fluent in both English and the language that you wish to use for your performance because you will be doing the translation. You will need to carefully watch how the words fit the music and pay close attention to word order when that is important to the music.
